

CORE Butte's school reopening plan is based upon all available resources and guidance from the following sources:

- Center for Disease Control (CDC)
- CalOSHA
- State of California
- California's Industry Guidance for Schools and School-Based Programs
- Butte County Public Health (BCPH)
- California Department of Education
- Special Education Local Plan Area
- State Department of Special Education

Staff, students and families are expected to take preventative measures:

- Self-screen for fever and/or respiratory infection symptoms prior to in-person commitments
- Stay home when sick
- Self-quarantine and COVID-19 testing required if exposure is suspected
- For any confirmed COVID-19 illness, clearance is required prior to returning to the school site or attending in-person gatherings that are school related
- All persons must wear a face covering at all times when at the resource center, if you have a medical exemption, a face shield with a drape is an appropriate alternative as per the state's industry standards for schools and school-based programs

Please only come to the resource center if you and your family can answer "no" to all four of the following questions:

- Have you or anyone you have been in close contact with been diagnosed with COVID-19 within the last 14 days?
- Have you or anyone you have been in close contact with recently experienced a fever (temperature over 100.4° F or 38° C) within the past 24 hours?
- Have you or anyone you have been in close contact with had COVID-19 symptoms in the last 24 hours (loss of smell, cough, sore throat, muscle aches, shortness of breath, nausea, vomiting, loss of appetite)?
- 4. Have you or anyone you have been in close contact with been asked to self-isolate or quarantine in the last 2 weeks?

Common Definitions During COVID-19 Restrictions

Nonessential Work: a task or activity that can be completed virtually

Essential Work: a task critical to the operation of the school that must be completed in-person. These tasks cannot be completed remotely or virtually, nor be placed on hold without having significant impact on the school or its students.

Gathering: Any event or convening that brings together more than one person in a single room or single indoor or outdoor space at the same time.

Social Distancing: Maintaining a six-foot separation from all persons except for household members, first responders and medical providers or employees conducting temperature screenings.
